What should you do when you an emergency vehicle is approaching?



Move to the Right for Sirens and Lights

- 1** Stay calm! Do not slam on the brakes or pull over suddenly.
- 2** Listen for the direction in which the vehicle is coming.
- 3** Put on the right-turn signal, and begin to move to the right if possible.
- 4** Pull to the right-hand side of the roadway and turn on the vehicle hazard flashers.
- 5** Remain stopped.

DO NOT FOLLOW WITHIN 500 FEET OF A FIRE TRUCK ANSWERING AN ALARM OR AN AMBULANCE WHEN THE FLASHING RED LIGHTS ARE ON.


We began as a volunteer fire department in 1955 to provide fire suppression and have evolved with the community to expand our services and provide the best possible approach to better serve the citizens.

Plan & Protect

How do I prepare for a fire in my home?

Smoke detectors combined with a planned and practiced escape plan saves lives. Test your smoke detectors and practice home fire drills once a month.

- Draw a floor plan of your home.
- Show two ways out of each room.
- Discuss escape routes with everyone in your home.
- Agree on an outside meeting place where everyone will gather once they've escaped.

MEDICAL

Emergency medical calls represent an estimated 70% of our average call volume. To respond effectively, our firefighters have at least the minimum required Emergency Medical Technician certification.

What should you do after you call 911?


- Make sure the address is visible.
